

Amos Herr House Foundation & Historical Society Preserving the History and Traditions of Hempfield

The 1852 Herr Family Homestead is a fine example of a Lancaster County farm property. The original 92–acre property was owned by members of the Herr family since 1844.

The first family member to reside there was Henry Herr, who was a descendent of Hans Herr, one of Lancaster's earliest settlers. Eventually, Amos B. Herr took over farming the property and raising tobacco. Amos and his wife, Emma made major renovations to the house in 1913. They had one child, Amos Rohrer Herr who began managing the property in 1926 upon the death of his father.

When Amos R. Herr's beloved wife Ethel passed away in 1974, he gave a portion of the then 55-acre tract to East Hempfield Township. Amos R. Herr lived at the farm until his death in 1987 when the remaining acreage was formally turned over to East Hempfield Township with the stipulation that the land be used for public good.

The 1852 Herr Family Homestead, barns and grounds are open on Saturdays from noon to 4 p.m. until October for tours. Visitors are encouraged to take a self-guided tour of the springhouse and surrounding gardens.

The Barns at The Herr Homestead Preserving the History and Traditions of Hempfield

The forebay or Sweitzer-Swisser barn and Tobacco shed at the Herr Homestead are excellent examples of Lancaster County farm buildings of the 19th and 20th centuries. The buildings contain tools and machinery used to plant, harvest, and process the crops that were grown in the fields that are now Amos Herr Park.

Tours of portions of the barns will give the visitor a glimpse of farm life and work in that bygone era.



The big barn (115' \times 70') housed cattle and horses on the lower level, and the barn floor was used to store straw, hay, and grain to feed the animals. The upper level was also used for storage of equipment drying tobacco.



The Tobacco shed measures 63° x 36° and was used to dry and process tobacco prior to its sale.
