Call to Order: 7:10 PM

1 .Welcome- given by President, Barry Brunner. Introduction of guests followed.

Secretary's report – Debby Bush – The secretary's report from the August 5, 2012 meeting/picnic was approved as published. Motion by Ann Byrne, second by Rainbear Mahoney. A thank you note was received from Carolyn Lawrence – \$1000.00 scholarship recipient – and was read to the membership.
Treasurer's report - Sue Bullitt – Financial statements and balance sheets distributed. Sue indicated that the Match show "lost a little money". She reported that the Agility Trial had a profit of about \$5000.00. The LKC taxes have been completed and the accountant has been paid. The insurance has also been reduced on the storage unit. Sue thanked Mary Lou Strayer for donating all of her Staples reward points to the Agility Trial. A motion was made by Hank Hillard, seconded by Jim Bullitt, that the Treasurer's report be approved as printed.

5. <u>Committee Reports</u> – as follows:

a. Agility Trial – Hank Hillard – The Agility Trial was held on the 29th and 30th of September. This was first time that we had ever done 3 rings. The Trial did not fill so we actually made about the same amount of money that we did last year. Hank stated that the Trail on the whole went well. Ann Byrne indicated that perhaps the reason that the Trial did not fill was due to the fact that we did not allow "mixed breed dogs". Hank agreed with this position. • Trivia:

- Mrs. Geraldine Rockefeller Dodge came to be known as the "first lady of dogdom" and "the dog fancier of the century". According to the Westminster Kennel Club website, in 1933, Mrs. Dodge became the first woman to officiate as the sole judge for Best In Show at its illustrious dog show. Her kennels were known as Giralda Farms Kennels.

In the early years of LKC her dogs were often exhibited at our May show and several took home BIS honors. Ch Springbank Ace of Giralda, an English Cocker Spaniel, was BIS twice in 1953 and 1954. Again in 1956, Ch Lucifer of Giralda, a Bloodhound received the coveted award.
