GENERAL MEMBERSHIP MEETING  
PARK CITY MALL COMMUNITY ROOM

**Call to Order:** 7:10 PM

1. **Welcome-** given by President, Barry Brunner. Introduction of guests followed.
2. **Secretary's report** – Debby Bush – The secretary's report from the August 5, 2012 meeting/picnic was approved as published. Motion by Ann Byrne, second by Rainbear Mahoney. A thank you note was received from Carolyn Lawrence – \$1000.00 scholarship recipient – and was read to the membership.
3. **Treasurer's report** - Sue Bullitt – Financial statements and balance sheets distributed. Sue indicated that the Match show “lost a little money”. She reported that the Agility Trial had a profit of about \$5000.00. The LKC taxes have been completed and the accountant has been paid. The insurance has also been reduced on the storage unit. Sue thanked Mary Lou Strayer for donating all of her Staples reward points to the Agility Trial. A motion was made by Hank Hillard, seconded by Jim Bullitt, that the Treasurer's report be approved as printed.
4. **AKC Delegate report** – Complete delegate's report from Carolyn Vack was distributed to the general membership and is attached to these minutes.
5. **Committee Reports** – as follows:
  - a. **Agility Trial** – Hank Hillard – The Agility Trial was held on the 29<sup>th</sup> and 30<sup>th</sup> of September. This was first time that we had ever done 3 rings. The Trial did not fill so we actually made about the same amount of money that we did last year. Hank stated that the Trail on the whole went well. Ann Byrne indicated that perhaps the reason that the Trial did not fill was due to the fact that we did not allow “mixed breed dogs”. Hank agreed with this position. Hank indicated that we have already included mixed breed dogs in our other performance events. Sue Bullitt offered that “this was actually done by Rau Dog Shows and not by LKC”. Following further discussion a motion was made by Joe Metro that “companion dogs be allowed to participate in performance events sponsored by LKC as is consistent with AKC policies”. Ann Byrne seconded the motion. The motion was carried by a majority, with 3 votes opposed. Mary Lou Strayer thanked everyone who volunteered and helped at the Trail as well. Barry added his “Thanks” to all those connected with the Agility Trial.
  - b. **Celtic Classic** – Ann Byrne reported on behalf of Tammy Selka. It was reported that the 2013 Judge's panel is set. The Celtic Classic is going to donate \$1500.00 to the York Canine unit. The committee is in the process of going over the Premium list that has to be in by Thanksgiving. There has been an updated agreement between the three clubs extending for 3 years.
  - c. **Christmas Party** – Ann Byrne reported that the Board of Director's had decided that those members that volunteer at 2 LKC events will receive a free Christmas dinner. She announced that the Christmas Party is December 13, 2012 at Leiderkranz. Please note that this is a Wednesday evening as the Leiderkrantz facility did not have the other preferred dates available. Ann also handed out a paper reservation form for the party at this meeting. Barry reiterated that the criteria also included : that you must be a member in good standing and must have attended at least one meeting during the course of the year. Barry also welcomed suggestions for alternative locations in the future.
6. **Unfinished Business- Newsletter** – Barry announced that there will be 3 Editors of the new LKC online Newsletter. The editors will be Barry Brunner, Bradley Frisbee, and Rainbear Mahoney. Barry requested that all members be certain that we have their current email addresses and that any changes be emailed to Barry or Debby.

7. **New Business –**

a. Applications – 3 applications have been sent to the general membership by the board of directors:

b. Rainbear suggested that the club entertain the idea of providing some interesting programs/seminars and speakers at the general meetings. Please send suggestions to Barry, Debby or Rainbear.

c. Joy Ellwanger asked if the club would be willing to provide 2 scholarships to high school students. Barry requested that she put something in writing to be presented to the Board.

d. By-Laws – Barry reported that the By-Laws were in New York being worked on.

e. Deb Radanovic – Thanked all those who supported RDOD.

f. Barry also reiterated that those members who volunteer at 2 events, are members in good standing and attend at least 1 meeting are also eligible for 50% off of club items – shirts, sweatshirts, jackets etc.

- **Trivia:**

- Mrs. Geraldine Rockefeller Dodge came to be known as the “first lady of dogdom” and “the dog fancier of the century”. According to the Westminster Kennel Club website, in 1933, Mrs. Dodge became the first woman to officiate as the sole judge for Best In Show at its illustrious dog show. Her kennels were known as Giralda Farms Kennels.

In the early years of LKC her dogs were often exhibited at our May show and several took home BIS honors. Ch Springbank Ace of Giralda, an English Cocker Spaniel, was BIS twice in 1953 and 1954. Again in 1956, Ch Lucifer of Giralda, a Bloodhound received the coveted award.
